The Confirmation Class

There are four students taking Confirmation study under the guiding of Kristal Gifford on Sunday morning here at New Scandinavia Lutheran Church.

The class is using the Luther's Small Catechism and presently they are studying "The Lord's Prayer." Did you know they are using "Faith Incubators" which is visual presentation study and a booklet to accompany teaching. Today's youth are programmed via school studies to learn visually in this technological age.

GIVING MISSION CAMPAIGN

When we received the money from the insurance from the fire, there was lots of discussions as to how to spend it. When the building was rebuilt, we had \$250,000 left. Dave Driver took the responsibility to invest the money wisely. It was put in the mission Investment fund at the ELCA which was paying the most interest. The CD's, which were 6 years, are now coming due. The interest on these CD's is about \$56,000.

At the time of the building much discussion centered around giving some of the money to the Glory of God. It was decided at that time that we would use the interest for that work. This is money we did not plan for, nor did we earn it. It was a gift. The council voted to give ½ away in this program and the next half will be invested and given away in 3 years. Thus every 3 years we would have extra money for mission without touching the principle.

The council has taken into consideration that a furnace could break etc. but they feel that the \$250,000 would cover any such need.

We would like to have people pick up the application at the back of the church or the one in the newsletter and apply for grants for their missions. We would like to give priority to missions that people give to or work with within the church. You would be allowed to apply for more than one. Ex: quilting \$500... and maybe school kits \$500.00. Wells may need a larger gift. Apply for what you need, and we will adjust the amount given as to how many requests.

A committee of 5 would than review all the requests and make the awards.

Do you financially support or work for this Organization:

We would like to accept applications in November and December. With the cutoff date being December 30. The money would then be awarded in a special dinner with a representative from the organization receiving the money present to give a little overview as to how the money would be used. Some publicity will be done to promote the fact that our church is working for the Glory of God.

Individuals that people have been working with are also included to receive the money should there be cancer etc. for need.

Candles will be lighted as well for: Dan Severude



DIGGING WELLS IN THIRD WORLD COUNTRIES

I am writing in response to a letter in the Messenger about wells being drilled in Third World countries where there wear out and nobody repairs them.

I would like to tell you about my experience with the well drilling. Barbara and I felt led by God to join a team to drill a well in Honduras. It is true that some wells needed to be repaired. That is what some of the team did. They helped in the repairing the wells that needed repairing. While we could only drill one well, they repaired three or more wells in the week that we were there. The first year we went, our church sponsored the well. In other words, we paid for the supplies for the well. We had the church name put on a plaque imbedded in cement around the well. There is also a phone number on the plaque for them to call if the pump needs to be repaired.

Another reason for going is to share God's love for them and to share our love for them as brothers and sisters in Christ. One of the native well drillers told me that it was better for us to come than to send the money for well drilling. By going down there and showing God's love and getting the job done was better than sending money where they might drink it away.

There was also fellowship with the team when we had devotions and prayer with the native well drillers and repair team. At that time, I had an awful cough. Our team leader pulled me aside and several people prayed for me. It took a while, but I am 90% better than I was then. What is interesting is that John McBride was one of the people praying for me. The next morning, he told us he was healed. He had a hip injury for twenty years and now the pain is gone. A year later I asked him how his hip is, and he said that it is great. Now he feels all his other pains.

While some of us were either drilling or repairing wells, the woman were teaching hygiene to the native woman and children as well as sharing God's word. They showed us their appreciation by serving us meals, donuts as a snack and were involved with the drilling.

It was a tremendous experience to have been a part of the team. God asks us to give our time, talents, and wealth, which He gave to us. When we do that, we are blessed and those we give to are blessed and we are glorifying God by doing that. We would have liked to go again but circumstances prevent that. I really feel like it was in God's plan for us to be there. There are some members of the team still going there to drill and repair wells.
