## BLUE CHRISTMAS SERVICE December 21 at 6:30

"It's the most wonderful time of the year..."

"It's the time of year when the world falls in love..."

"I'm dreaming of a white Christmas, just like the ones I used to know..."

We don't want to talk about it, but while some cheerfully hum along to these and other Christmas songs, others are quietly struggling to find a way of pushing through the holiday season- to just make it through. The truth is that the time from [the week of] Thanksgiving all the way through New Years is very difficult on those who are grieving, those who battle season depression, those who are lonely, and those who are simply sad. And when everyone around them seems chipper and festive, where can those struggling go, who may need time away and be honest with their feelings?

The idea behind the Blue Christmas service is to provide a quiet, contemplative service as an alternative to the more traditional gatherings to care for those who are sad or struggling while those around them are caught up in celebrating. It is for those who are grieving a recent loss and those who's loved one died many years ago. It is for those who are spending another Christmas single and for those who may still be married (but only on paper). It is for those who are struggling with what it means to live in a broken world, where there are mass shootings and diseases that take the lives of people who are "way too young". It is for those watching loved ones forget the simplest things, like names. It's for those who are affected by the lack of sunlight and suffer the effects of seasonal depression. It's for those who received "a diagnosis." The simplest way of putting it? It is for those who are struggling. (period!)

This service provides an opportunity for people to hear not about the baby in the manger, who can be dismissed as irrelevant, but about the God of love who comes to us in the midst of the mess and pain we know in our own everyday lives and in the lives of those around us.

If you are struggling, know that this space is for you to grieve how you need. No one here will tell you to "suck it up". No one here will tell you that "it is time to move on". No one here will judge you for your grief and how you handle it. No one will judge you because those in space are grieving as well. So, come.

#### Mary the Brave: Mary the God Bearer

As a young pastor and working mom, I struggled with the challenges of balancing work and home life, often

while carrying a child in my womb, arms, on my hip, in a front or back baby pack, or car seat. Now my children are adults, and I have the joy of watching them carry my grandchildren. They do it differently than I did, their car seats are much nicer than the ones we had, but like us, they carry their children with much love. I still carry my adult children and grandchildren and will always carry them, in my heart with much love. This Advent and Christmas season I'm reflecting on Mary, the God bearer. (In Greek it's Theotokos².) Mary carried Jesus. Like all parents she carried her child with love, but she is also the God bearer. It was a brave thing Mary did to bear God into the world.

To love is a brave thing. It is a brave thing to become a parent. Mothers put their own lives at risk bearing a child in their womb and giving birth. It requires a measure of bravery for parents to bring a child into this world filled with the bad news of climate disasters, gun violence, war, political upheaval, racism, food/water insecurity, and escalating health and higher education costs.

Luke 1: 26ff In the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent by God to a town in Galilee called Nazareth, to a virgin engaged to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David. The virgin's name was Mary. And he came to her and said, "Greetings, favored one! The Lord is with you... "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. And now, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you will name him Jesus. He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High, ... the child to be born will be holy; he will be called Son of God... For nothing will be impossible with God." Then Mary said, "Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word." Then the angel departed from her.

History has painted Mary to be quiet, meek and mild, submissive to God's will, but a closer read shows us that Mary was brave. Mary was neither meek nor superhuman.<sup>3</sup> She had grit. She was faithful, courageous, strong and brave. Most of all, she was human. Her encounter with the angel Gabriel, the messenger of God made her brave. She knew that her pregnancy was dangerous and she could die giving birth. She also knew that as an unmarried teenaged mother it would cause upheaval in her family and community. She would give birth to Jesus during Roman occupation, a time of political unrest. Mary was *brave*. Her encounter with the living God made her brave

Her encounter with God gave her bravery and the faith to see that if God was calling her God would also protect her. It revealed to her that God chooses the people on the margins, those overlooked and underestimated. Bearing God in the world was to bring good news and hope to those oppressed. May Mary, the God Bearer, inspire us all to be brave!

This Advent and Christmas season, I invite you to be Theotokos, God Bearers. I invite you to carry the good news of Christ's birth, life, death and resurrection to all those we meet on this journey of life and the love of Jesus in your hearts always.
